



One of the most significant achievements this year was the inauguration of the Samprada Singh Memorial Radiotherapy Centre in Muzaffarpur. This state-of-the-art facility honours the vision of our Founder and

stands as Bihar's largest radiotherapy centre, offering advanced cancer care to thousands across the region and neighbouring states.

We also expanded the Alkem Anemia Mukti Abhiyaan, reaching over 1,09,000 beneficiaries across six states. By focusing on awareness, nutrition, and improved hygiene, the programme continues to support the national goal of an anemia-free India through localised, community-led action.

Looking ahead, we remain focused on continuing and deepening these efforts. The next phase of AAMA will aim to establish Anemia Mukt Panchayats, targeting adolescents, women, and children through a mix of awareness drives, screenings, and behaviour change strategies. Simultaneously, our Comprehensive Cancer Care Programme will broaden its focus to include early detection, training of healthcare professionals, and homebased palliative care.

Beyond healthcare, we are excited to launch a Water Neutrality Programme to promote sustainable water usage, improve water quality, and engage communities in resource management. Our Integrated Village Development model will bring together health, education, livelihood, and socio-infrastructure interventions to enable holistic rural development.

We believe that real progress lies in empowering people. This journey of impact is made possible by the collective dedication of our teams, the enduring partnerships we've built, and the communities who inspire our every effort. Your continued collaboration fuels our resolve to keep doing better, together.

#### Dear Esteemed Stakeholders,

This year has been deeply fulfilling for us at Alkem Foundation. Across our programmes, we have had the privilege of connecting with communities at a meaningful level, supporting health, education, livelihoods, and dignity.

Our healthcare efforts made significant strides. The Alkem Anemia Mukti Abhiyaan touched over a lakh lives, spreading awareness and improving health behaviours across six states. Our partnership with Tata Memorial Centre helped extend the reach of early cancer diagnosis and palliative care, while the operationalisation of the Samprada Singh Memorial Radiotherapy Centre in Muzaffarpur marked a major milestone in decentralised

cancer treatment. Through mobile medical units and upgraded rural health infrastructure, a large number of individuals across Maharashtra, Sikkim, and Himachal Pradesh received essential services. In Bihar, Besarbati Panchayat achieved 100% Ayushman Card coverage, ensuring every eligible citizen now has access to free medical treatment.

The Swabhiman Kaksh inaugurated in Soreng created a safe, hygienic space for adolescent girls, helping them stay in school with dignity. In livelihood and education, our efforts supported over 150 women in Sikkim through mushroom and noodle production units, enabled youth in Daman through vocational courses, and extended scholarships to vulnerable students.

Building on these foundations, our upcoming projects include expanding the Anemia Mukti Abhiyaan through community-based screenings and awareness drives, extending a comprehensive cancer care programme focused on early detection and palliative support, and implementing an Integrated Village Development approach that will enable entire communities to thrive. We will also continue strengthening water conservation, health access, and livelihood training across our operational areas.

To every employee, partner, and community member who has been part of this journey, thank you. Your support, trust, and belief in our work inspire us to keep going further.

Throughout 2024–25, our focus at Alkem Foundation has been on building programmes that respond to ground realities with clarity and precision. This practical, solution-driven approach has helped us strengthen existing interventions and introduce new ones that promise long-term social value.

Healthcare continued to remain a key focus. With the successful functioning of the Samprada Singh Memorial Radiotherapy Centre in Muzaffarpur, we took a major step towards decentralising cancer care. Simultaneously, the

Alkem Anemia Mukti Abhiyaan touched the lives of over 1 Lakh individuals through awareness, screening, and preventive care. In Bihar, we achieved complete Ayushman Card coverage for all eligible individuals in Besarbati Panchayat, an example of how localised interventions can deliver universal access.

Looking ahead, we aim to deepen our impact through initiatives focused on early cancer detection, water neutrality, and integrated village development. Plans are underway to expand anemia prevention efforts, improve rural healthcare access, and build stronger livelihood pathways through skill training and infrastructure support.

Our commitment to economic empowerment also took tangible form. Through our projects like livelihood initiatives for disadvantaged women in Sikkim, skills training in Daman, and scholarships for students in need; we prioritised long-term capability over short-term assistance. Parallelly, social infrastructure initiatives and efforts to promote menstrual hygiene and school retention further contributed to community well-being.

SMILE, our employee volunteering platform, was a powerful enabler again this year. Whether it was awareness walks for Alzheimer and Dementia, tree plantation drives, inclusive sports, or blood donation campaigns, over 10,000 Alkemites actively participated. Their collective engagement bridged the gap between our strategy and the lived realities of people on the ground, adding heart to every effort.

As we close this year, I am encouraged by the consistency of our results and the clarity of our direction. #### **Why It Mattered**

In the communities we serve, timely healthcare can change lives, but it is often out of reach. Our work addresses challenges such as:



Delayed care due to lack of awareness or distant facilities



Overlooked groups, especially women and the elderly



Rising NCDs like anemia, cancer, and Alzheimer's adding silent pressure on families



Wider impact on livelihoods, education, and dignity



The need for trust, not just treatment, making care accessible and part of daily life



#### **Efforts in Action during 2024-25**

This year, our healthcare interventions focused on reaching underserved communities with preventive, diagnostic, and specialised services. From community-level screening and awareness programmes to the launch of a state-of-the-art radiotherapy centre, each initiative was designed to respond to pressing needs and bridge persistent healthcare gaps.



#### **Early Cancer Screening Camps in Bihar**

To promote early detection and intervention, cancer screening camps were organised across three districts of Bihar. These camps focused on screening for breast, cervical, and oral cancers, helping identify potential risks at an early stage and linking beneficiaries with follow-up care. The initiative played a crucial role in increasing awareness about symptoms and prevention.

#### **Palliative Services at the Doorstep**

To support individuals with life-limiting illnesses, home-based palliative care services were provided, offering comfort, dignity, and support in familiar surroundings. This initiative focused on symptom relief, emotional wellbeing, and continuity of care by integrating medical, psychological, and daily assistance into patients' homes. Regular home visits, teleconsultations, and coordinated medical support ensured that patients received attentive and respectful care tailored to their needs.

#### A Milestone in Cancer Care. A Commitment Fulfilled.

For far too long, specialised cancer treatment remained out of reach for patients in North Bihar. With limited radiotherapy infrastructure concentrated in Patna, timely intervention often meant travelling long distances – delaying diagnosis, increasing costs, and compromising outcomes.

We recognised this gap and took responsibility to act.

On December 11, 2024, the
Samprada Singh Memorial
Radiotherapy Centre in Muzaffarpur,
a state-of-the-art facility developed
in partnership with the Tata
Memorial Centre, Mumbai was
inaugurated by Alkem Foundation.
Located in an aspirational district,
this Centre is designed to serve
patients from across Bihar, eastern
Uttar Pradesh, Jharkhand, and
beyond.

With an investment of ₹ 100 Crores 70%, of our CSR funding over the years, this Centre represents our largest healthcare commitment to date.

More than a facility, it is a symbol of equitable access, built in memory of Late Shri Samprada Singh, our Founder and Chairman Emeritus, who believed that geography should never define the quality of care a person receives.

#### Alkem Anemia Mukti Abhiyaan

As part of the Alkem Anemia Mukti Abhiyaan, we expanded our screening programme across multiple regions, particularly targeting adolescent girls and women of reproductive age. This initiative aimed to identify undiagnosed cases early and direct them towards treatment. Local community workers were also engaged in spreading awareness around nutrition and prevention.

#### **Mission Ayushman**

Through our Mission Ayushman outreach, we connected with families in rural communities to raise awareness about public health schemes. #### Alkem Aarogya Project: Mobile Clinics for Underserved Regions

To bridge geographic and systemic barriers, the Alkem Aarogya project was initiated, under which mobile health units were deployed in select locations, delivering basic medical services directly to remote communities. These units served as travelling clinics, providing health check-ups, essential medicines, and referrals, especially in regions with no nearby primary health centre.

#### Savita's Journey Towards Health: From Severe to Mild Anemia



I am a 21-year-old student, from Chilkahar, UP. I used to feel tired and dizzy, unaware I had severe anemia.

Thanks to a health camp under the Alkem Anemia Mukti Abhiyaan project, my condition was detected (Hb: 6.9). With timely treatment and nutrition support, my Hb rose to 12.0 in just 3 months.

Now, I'm healthy, regular in class, and helping others learn about healthy habits.

#### Transforming Tiny Lives: My Journey with Alkem Foundation



I'm Roshani Pawar, a 33-year-old mother whose twin daughters were born underweight (2.1 kgs and 1.3 kg). With AAMA Sakhi's support through home visits, I learned about exclusive breastfeeding and postnatal nutrition.

Following their advice on healthy eating and hygiene, my daughters gained 5.8 kgs and 6.2 kgs in just a few months, showing how timely support transforms challenges into success.

#### Life-Saving Care through Ayushman Bharat: Ram Balak Das's Story



I am Ram Balak Das from Hathiduba village. I struggled with a severe heart condition for six months until I received the Ayushman Bharat card under PMJAY. In October, I underwent life-saving heart surgery in Patna costing ₹ 2 Lakhs, fully covered by the scheme. I'm grateful to Alkem Foundation for their support, which enabled me to receive treatment without financial worries and transformed my life.

#### **Way Forward**

We have witnessed the transformative impact of taking healthcare to the community, rather than expecting the community to come to healthcare. Going forward, we aim to strengthen this approach by expanding our Alkem Aarogya project in underserved areas and conducting more regular screening camps focused on prevention and early diagnosis. Our anemia and cancer care initiatives like kitchen gardens, soap banks, seed distribution drives, will continue to evolve, shaped by community feedback and field insights. Ultimately, we seek to make health a shared responsibility – not just a service, but a collective commitment.













#### **Efforts in Action during 2024-25**

In 2024–25, our education initiatives focused on improving access, supporting learning continuity, and creating enabling environments for children from diverse backgrounds. We addressed gaps in infrastructure, inclusivity, and affordability, while encouraging digital learning and student retention.



#### **Inclusive Education Initiatives**

Recognising the challenges faced by children with special needs in mainstream classrooms, we facilitated targeted interventions to improve learning accessibility. This included working with trained educators and using assistive tools to help children engage with curriculum content at their own pace. The aim was to ensure that every learner had the support they needed to grow with confidence.

## **Creating Safe Spaces for Adolescent Girls**

To support adolescent health and school attendance, a dedicated facility was set up at PM Shri Government Senior Secondary School in Soreng, Sikkim, providing girls with essential amenities such as sanitary pads, clean water, and hygienic disposal units. This initiative promotes menstrual hygiene awareness while fostering a sense of comfort, dignity, and continuity in education for young girls in underserved communities. This initiative of ours received endorsement and appreciation from the Sikkim Government.

Environmental degradation in rural areas often goes unnoticed, but its impact is far-reaching. Our work addresses:

Soil erosion, water runoff, and degraded land, which threaten agriculture and tree cover

#### **Efforts in Action** during 2024-25

Our environmental efforts in 2024-25 focused on practical, communitydriven actions that balanced ecological restoration with local well-being. We launched the second phase of the Water Hyacinth Nutrient Remediation project to address invasive species and restore aquatic ecosystem health. Mass plantation drives were conducted in Mandva and Naugama, in collaboration with local communities to expand green cover and strengthen biodiversity. The Go Green campaign saw widespread tree plantation activities, while clean-up drives in Samardung encouraged volunteer-led garbage collection and reinforced the value of shared environmental responsibility.

#### **Way Forward**

We are now looking at ways to build on these efforts through more integrated environmental initiatives. In the coming year, we plan to support eco-sustainability at the village level by combining tree plantations with other nature-based solutions likewater conservation methods, and local awareness programmes. Our aim is to grow not just trees, but a deeper connection between people and their environment, one rooted in care, ownership, and continuity.











## Sport as a Pathway to Progress

We believe in the power of sport to uplift, unite, and inspire. Our work supports young athletes from underserved regions by giving them access to coaching, facilities, and the encouragement they need to pursue their dreams. Beyond medals and matches, we see sport as a way to build confidence, discipline, and pride, within individuals and across communities.

#### **Progressive Impact** through the Years

Our engagement in sports is rooted in the belief that talent flourishes through sustained support and strategic intervention. We have backed highperformance programmes that demand long-term commitment, helping shape resilient and future-ready athletes. Alongside these enduring efforts, we have also designed shorter, need-based interventions, whether to bridge critical gaps or provide timely impetus at crucial stages in an athlete's journey. #### **Efforts in Action** during 2024-25

Our sports interventions this year were geared towards developing talent from the grassroots level, particularly in regions with limited access to structured training. By supporting capacity-building initiatives, we aimed to nurture athletic ability while instilling discipline, confidence, and aspiration in young sportspersons.

#### **Backing Champions on the Global Stage**

In 2024-25, we worked closely with two major partners, Olympic Gold Quest and the Sikkim Football Association, to support athlete development. Our contribution enabled focused training, improved access to coaching, and greater exposure to competitive opportunities. While Olympic Gold Quest supported high-potential athletes preparing for international events, our involvement in Sikkim fostered local football talent through camps and matches designed to elevate performance and visibility.

With consistency and care, we hope to help many more young athletes take their first confident steps towards national and global platforms.



## **Impact through SMILE**

Our SMILE initiative, Support to Make Individual Lives Easier, was born from a simple idea: turning compassion into action through employee-led volunteering. What started as a small effort has evolved into a structured platform where Alkem employees support causes they care about. #### **A Cancer Care Milestone**

- Water Conservation: Implementing strategies to enhance water conservation, reduce water wastage, promote efficient usage and increase the adoption of water-saving technologies among farmers and households.
- Water Quality Improvement: Promoting best practices for water management to ensure safe drinking water and healthier ecosystems.
- **Community Engagement:** Building awareness and capacity within local communities through educational programmes and participatory approaches, empowering them to take an active role in water management.

#### **Improvement in Health Indicators**

- Providing primary healthcare services to communities near operational areas through mobile healthcare units.
- Organising specialised medical camps and awareness sessions (anemia screening, orthopaedics, gynaecology, dermatology, etc).
- Strengthening, supporting and upgrading rural primary health centres and government hospitals.
- Ensuring access to safe drinking water and improving hygiene practices in underserved villages.

#### **Support to Livelihood Programmes**

- Identifying local youth for skill development programmes.
- Providing industry-relevant training and facilitating employment opportunities, thereby enhancing income and livelihood opportunities.

#### **Support to Educational Initiatives**

- Transformation and holistic development of educational institutions in close association with likeminded organisations.
- Providing scholarships and financial assistance to meritorious and underprivileged students.

#### **Socio-infrastructure Development**

- Building and maintaining community sanitation facilities, including toilets and waste management systems.
- Infrastructure facilities, street lighting, and safe public spaces in rural and semi-urban areas.
